Before the big game, a spirited crowd enjoyed performances by high school and middle school cheer teams, interacted with the Andover Fire Department and participated in a free raffle drawing. The event was free to the public thanks to generous donations from Kice Industries and food sponsor Equity Bank.

Shortly after the tailgate event we hosted a gala at Crestview Country Club where parents, donors, community leaders and board members came together to celebrate the Foundation's 20th anniversary. *A huge success as we raised more than \$60,000 for Andover Public Schools*, the evening included dinner, dancing, raffle prizes, a video tribute to our founding members and an introduction to two very exciting districtwide fundraising initiatives. 

Rallied Support For District Vision

Impacting student hearts and minds. Enlarging futures

The board of directors of the Foundation made the decision this year to support two important districtwide projects. One project invites collaboration and discovery. The second will help build life skills that can literally change the trajectory of a student's life and work.

Innovation Academy

Innovation Academy projects are designed to transform environments from traditional to leading edge, exposing students to best-practice technology used today in higher education and the workforce. In the initial phase of this district project, 10 Andover school libraries will become innovative learning spaces designed to fully immerse students in a collaborative culture. Incorporating multiple learning styles and flexible seating configurations, the Academy will engage students in authentic learning projects. Launching in media centers and projected to expand to Andover school classrooms, the Academy has the potential to redesign learning in a powerful way. Students will be able to Skype with students in other parts of the world or film a video subject against a green screen.

Innovation Academy will make an intentional connection to the new state vision for Kansas (Kansans Can) and the Kansans Can School Redesign project that will engage each school in Kansas within the next 10 years.

Asked to reflect on indicators that the Innovation Academy environment is successful, **Heather Hawkins, Andover Central library media specialist**, pointed to these:



“ Student interest and excitement as evidenced by students flocking to the media center. More memorable experiences. Teachers collaborating with the media specialist to supplement curriculum. Community members becoming involved with student projects to assist in relevant learning and help guide student futures and occupations.”

Capturing Kids' Hearts

The social and environmental pressures on our kids are immense, and they affect the quality of the classroom environment. Capturing Kids' Hearts is a national initiative and immersive experience that models and teaches social skills like a handshake or greeting someone by name. At the highest level, it's designed to increase appropriate behavior in the classroom, decrease bullying, strengthen student connectedness and lower suicide rates. Schools across the country that have implemented Capturing Kids' Hearts processes report:

- Fewer negative behaviors and decline in isolation, violence, early sexuality and substance use
- Significant improvement in student academic performance
- Districtwide improvements in test scores
- Higher rate of job satisfaction among teachers
- Increased teacher retention and improvement in teacher recruiting



Roadmap For Success

Partnering for fidelity and accountability

The Foundation partners with the Wichita Community Foundation to help manage our pool of endowments. This strategic partnership maximizes oversight, reporting and performance. It also gives our donors the ability to expand their giving options to include scholarships, memorials and non-traditional or lifetime gifting to The Foundation for Andover Schools. A critical benefit, this strategic partnership frees our volunteer board members to spend more time securing as many private dollars for the district as possible.


New Ways To Give

account and direct giving to us through the DYC web-based giving app, you’ll give automatically every time you spend.







Picture of a Bright Giving Future






